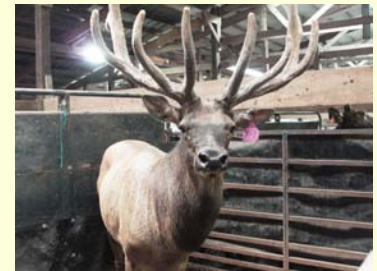
What's in a rotation?

Public health is more than you think.



What will you do?

The rotation will be a mixture of readings, discussions on many public health topics, videos, a micro lab experience, presentations, and awesome field-trips. Possible field-trips include visits to the Blank Park Zoo, Des Moines Water Plant, Iowa State Fair, tattoo studio, exotic animal auction, Ames Animal Shelter, a food processor, brewery, Iowa Department of Public Health, the State Emergency Op Center, and others. Guest speakers also visit the class. The rotation is flexible and open to changes based upon what you want.



Public health: It's part of your Veterinary Oath. You use it everyday, and as a veterinarian you'll use it even more. Public health is an extremely diverse field covering numerous diseases, conditions, and situations. As a veterinarian, you'll have the skills and background necessary to work on issues you never thought possible, on some of the biggest

threats facing animal and human health today. The field is wide open, waiting for you. The Association of Schools of Public Health estimates that 250,000 more public health workers will be needed by 2020. This challenge is compounded by the fact that 23% of the current workforce – almost 110,000 workers – are eligible to retire by 2012.
